Scholarship Overview

The Robert and Moira Sansom Ideas Foundation at London Community Foundation supports the Graduate Student Scholarship for Studies in the History of Ideas.

Scholarship Amount: \$10,000

Eligibility: The Graduate Student Scholarship for Studies in the History of Ideas welcomes applications from graduate students, for study in a Canadian university, whose work relates to the History of Ideas.

In the past few years awards have been made to students working in political science, history, philosophy, and the history of art, but we take the history of ideas to be broadly defined and no field of intellectual history will be excluded from consideration.

The scholarship is intended to support work in the 2024-2025 academic year.

Application Process: Complete the questions and upload your letter of application, relevant transcripts and curriculum vitae. NOTE: A scholarship applicant is responsible for being aware of any conditions or conflicts that may arise with their pre-existing funding before they submit an application.

Also, all applicants must arrange for two academic reference letters to be sent directly by their referees to award trustees Dr. Mark G. Spencer and Dr. Richard Vernon.

Application Dates: The application will open on Tuesday, November 28, 2023 with a deadline of March 1, 2024 at 2:00 PM.

Selection Process: The selection process will take place in the spring and applicants will be notified of the results in June 2024.
